Part 3: Wear a costume to become this person. You must have a costume that is representative of the person and easily recognizable as something the person might wear. You do not need to purchase a costume; use materials and objects from your home.

Part 4: Use a marker and draw a circle on your hand or wrist with a "Push Here" button label. When students and parents visit the class' Living Wax Museum, they will "push" the button and "activate" your speech function.
