### Community welcomes new superintendent

There's no secret about what's in the heart of Birdville ISD's new superintendent.

"We are here to do what is best for the kids," said Stephen F. Waddell, Ed.D., who began his term as superintendent March 4. "We are here to make sure that our students are happy and successful in life."

Waddell desires to see BISD become an "exemplary" district in every way. With student achievement as his top priority, he plans to focus on continuing the explosion of student interest in technology, furthering community and parent involvement, and effectively managing district finances.

"I am proud to be in BISD," Waddell said. "I am excited to be joining a district that has been recognized as a premier district across the state. I feel a sense of humility in BISD and I look forward to

moving forward with the legacy."

He also said that BISD is a quality district that can and must move forward, continuing to reach for a higher goal.

Board president Wanda Strong described Waddell as a champion for education.

"He really has a heart for the children," she said.

Waddell, 50, comes to BISD from Tuloso-Midway ISD in Corpus Christi, where he served as superintendent since 1998. He also served as superintendent of Sunray ISD, principal and assistant principal in Lancaster ISD, and counselor and teacher in Splendora ISD.

He was hired by BISD's Board of Trustees at a special meeting Feb. 12. Waddell succeeds Bob E. Griggs, Ed.D., who retired after nine years as BISD superintendent.

## Summer school registration set for May 31

BISD's summer school program for students in grades six through 12 will be June 4-July 10 at Richland High School. Tuition for each class is \$100 for in-district students, with a \$20 registration fee. Registration is set for Friday, May 31, at W.G. Thomas Coliseum.

The summer program allows middle and high school students to seek remediation in order to be promoted to the next grade level. It also allows students who have completed grade eight or higher to take high school courses for acceleration. Courses available are: English

language arts, mathematics, science, social studies, technology applications, health, speech, TAAS remediation, and SAT preparation.

# Commissioner approves BISD calendar for 2002-2003 year

Jim Nelson, commissioner of education for the State of Texas, approved Birdville ISD's waiver for the 2002-2003 school year on Feb. 26. BISD submitted a waiver requesting the commissioner's approval to begin the 2002-2003 school year earlier than the state-mandated week of Aug. 21. After reviewing the results of two calendar votes and comments made at a public hearing on Dec. 3, 2001, the commissioner approved the Aug. 13, 2002 start date.

State law requires school districts wishing to begin earlier than the

week of Aug. 21 to solicit community input about the proposed calendar and, based on that input, submit a request for a waiver. The commissioner then reviews the district's request, along with the results of the public hearing, to determine if the school district has the community's support for an earlier start date. This process must be repeated every year.
