Haltom High School is one of four high schools in the Birdville Independent School District. Haltom High School is a traditional comprehensive public high school offering rigorous instruction as well as competitive athletic and fine arts programs. Students have the option to take Career and Technical Education classes at the Birdville Center for Advanced Learning (BCTAL) to earn industry based certifications. We also offer an embedded dual credit program by partnering with Texas Woman's University. In 2019, Birdville ISD and Tarrant County College -Northeast Campus partnered to open the first early college high school within Birdville ISD, the Collegiate Academy of Birdville (CAB). The CAB is housed at Haltom High School on the 2nd floor as a school within a school model. Students have access to TCC facilities and resources and may also participate in athletics, fine arts, and elective classes at Haltom High School.

Haltom is on a two-semester system with two nine-week grading periods per semester. The school day is from 7:30 A.M. – 2:50 P.M. and consists of seven periods. Students in grade 9 and 10 must be enrolled in seven classes a day, 11th grade in a minimum of six classes, and 12th grade students in a minimum of four classes.

Dual Credit courses include English 3, English 4, US History, College Algebra, Statistics, Government and Economics, and are offered through Texas Woman's University and Tarrant County College.

The Collegiate Academy of Birdville partners with Tarrant County College-Northeast Campus to offer dual credit courses at the college campus.
