



- Fine Arts (Theater Lighting) improvements at all three high schools








### **REBUILD Haltom Middle School**

# REBUILD Cheney and Richland Elementary Schools (Partnership)

**EST. 1952** 

- Eliminates eight portable classrooms
- Estimated Cost to Repair
   Cheney Exceeds 74% of Cost to Rebuild
- Estimated Cost to Repair Richland Exceeds 59% of Cost to Rebuild










- TOTAL BOND AMOUNT
  - > \$252.8 Million
- SCHOOL BOND ELECTION
  - ➤ A vote of the public to authorize Birdville ISD to levy a tax to pay for the building program.
- EST. TAX IMPACT
   >\$1.71/Month based on BISD average taxable home valuation of \$137K





# **Estimated Tax Impact**

(Based on Taxable Value)



- TOTAL BOND AMOUNT
  - >\$252.8 Million
- EST. TAX IMPACT
  - >\$1.25/Month for \$100K
  - >\$1.71/Month for \$137K \$2.50/Month for \$200K
  - >\$5.00/Month for \$400K
