What is ACE?

ACE stands for Afterschool Centers on Education. The name of our ACE program is ASPIRE - After School Program Inspiring and Reinforcing Education.

We offer structured, safe and supervised places for learning and social interaction.

We offer innovative, hands on activities that reinforce and complement students' regular academic programs (before/after school, summer).

Our programs strive to increase promotion and graduation rates and to help prepare students for college and the workplace.

What are the benefits of ASPIRE?

Students who regularly participate in ASPIRE benefit from:

- A free, safe, and engaging place to spend time before school, after school and during the summer.
- Opportunities to participate in innovative enrichment activities.
- Needs-based academic support aligned with the school day.
- Targeted activities to promote college and career readiness.
- Caring relationships with adults.
- Increased likelihood of attending school, developing better social/emotional skills, and advancing to the next grade.

Our programs strive to improve:

- Academics Improve student grades by at least one point in English/Language Arts/Reading.
- **Attendance** Improve student school day attendance by a percentage point.
- **Behavior** Ninety-five percent of regular participants will have no discipline referrals.
- **Promotion** Ninety-five percent of student participants will promote to the next grade.
- **Graduation** All program participants will be exposed to college/workforce activities.

Budget

- We are grant funded by the **21st Century Community Learning Centers (CCLC) Grant**.
- Our program's funding is limited to 3-5 years (currently in year 4).
- Cycle 10 received \$1.5 million for the current school year 2021- 2022.
- ASPIRE programs are encouraged to collaborate with their campus including purchases with a 60/40 split.
- Looking ahead we plan to apply for the next grant cycle for the 2023-2024 school year.
