WHAT IS DUAL CREDIT?

- An opportunity for high school students to take college-level courses that simultaneously award high school and college credit.
- Academic or Career and Technical Education (CTE) credits.
- Offered at RHS, BCTAL, and TCC.




WHY CHOOSE DUAL CREDIT?

Tuition Costs



- \$59 per credit hour for Tarrant County residents \$177 per three-hour course. (Out of county tuition is \$106/credit hour.)
- Note: Tuition must be paid for fall and again for spring.
- High school students who have earned 24 college credits or more upon graduation save about \$15,000.
- TCC Grant funds available for qualifying students.

- available to study at least 6 hours a week for a 3-credit class
- comfortable asking instructors questions
- willing to get help when they are struggling




DUAL CREDIT AT RHS

- Dual Credit GPA calculation is same as Pre-AP (1.10)
- Your counselor schedules dual credit classes based on your other scheduled courses.
- Dual credit instructors are assigned, not chosen by you.

Dual Credit vs. Advanced Placement

| Description | Allows students to take college-level courses and exams, and to earn college credit or placement while still in high school. | Allows high school students to simultaneously earn high school and college credit by completing courses at their high school. |
| Credit | No guarantee upon completion of course; must pass The College Board Exam with a 3 or above. | Guaranteed college credit upon successful completion of course. |
| Teacher / Instructors | Taught by the high school teachers trained by The College Board. | Taught by college instructors and/or high school teachers who serve as adjunct professors. |
| College / University Acceptance | Accepted throughout the nation with acceptable scores. Consult individual college institution for their policy. | Accepted at public college and universities in Texas, as well as many other colleges and universities across the nation. Consult individual college for their policy. |
| Location | Courses are taught at the high school. | Courses may be taught at the high school, online, or at a Tarrant County College Campus. |
| Eligibility | Open to any student | Must have high school approval Must meet TSI eligibility requirements for college-level course work |
| Cost | \$91 test fee (waivers may be available) | \$59/credit hour (Grant funds may be available) |



YOUR COLLEGE TRANSCRIPT

- When you take Dual Credit, you enroll as a TCC student.
- Dual Credit classes start your college GPA and transcript.
- Dual Credit grades are reported on your permanent, official college transcript from TCC, and can be seen by every university to which you apply.



WILL MY CREDITS TRANSFER?



- ALWAYS ask the school where you plan to complete your degree what transfer credits they accept.
- If you plan to attend a public Texas university, it is worth noting which classes are part of the Texas Core Curriculum, as they will transfer in a block.

What is the Texas Core Curriculum?



The Texas Core Curriculum is a block of 42 credits that is guaranteed to transfer between public Texas colleges and universities to be substituted for the corresponding core curriculum of the receiving institution.



It is **not** the same as the national Common Core standards for K-12.

STUDENT ACCESSIBILITY RESOURCES



FERPA AND DUAL CREDIT

- The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act
 (FERPA) is a federal law that protects the privacy of
 student education records. The law applies to all
 schools that receive funds under an applicable
 program of the U.S. Department of Education, i.e.
 TCC.
- Rights transfer solely to the student at age 18 or if the student attends a schools beyond the high school level.
- For Dual Credit students, the high school and college may exchange information on a student. If the student is under 18, the parent/guardian still retains the rights under FERPA at the high school and may inspect and review any records sent by TCC to the high school.



What is the TSI-A?


- The TSI is the placement test mandated by the State of Texas for students taking classes at public higher education institutions in Texas.
- You must take the TSI Assessment before enrolling in classes.
- The TSI has 3 sections Reading, Writing, and Math.
- The average time to complete all three sections is 3-5 hours, but it is not timed. You have 14 calendar days to complete the test from when you start.

How Do I Take the TSI-A?

- Before you take the TSI, the state of Texas mandates that all students view a roughly 25 minute video called the Pre-Assessment Activity (PAA) that goes over the test format.
- Richland HS is an official TSI Test Site, and most students complete testing here. The school counselors provide TCC with the score reports.
- Potential dual credit students may also take the TSI at the TCC Testing Center at no cost (including re-testing) after getting a referral from the Dual Credit office.



TSI EXEMPTIONS




- You may be exempt from taking the TSI if you have qualifying scores on the SAT or ACT tests.
- SAT minimum exemption scores (March 5, 2016 or after):
 - Verbal/Writing 480
 - Math 530
 - No requirement for the combined score
- ACT minimum exemption scores:
 - English 19
 - Math 19
 - Required composite 23
- Official score report must be sent to Tarrant County College from College Board or ACT.

DUAL CREDIT REIMBURSEMENT GRANT

- The Dual Credit Reimbursement Grant is available on a first-come-first-serve basis to students who qualify financially.
- The application form is available through the Dual Credit office.
- Students must complete the FAFSA and submit the Grant Request Form to TCC's Northeast Financial Aid Office.
- Students may apply throughout the semester in which they are taking courses.





TEXTBOOKS

- You are expected to have your textbook on the first day of class.
- After you receive your dual credit schedule from your counselor, you can buy your textbook from any TCC campus bookstore or online at tccd.bncollege.com.
- If you rent your textbook or buy it from another retailer, be certain to buy the textbook with the correct ISBN number, as there are often multiple editions.

CLASS ATTENDANCE

- You must attend class 85% of the time; failure to do so may result in the professor dropping you from class.
- Involvement in high school extra-curricular activities does not excuse you from course responsibilities or attendance.
- If you decide you are not ready to take the class after all, you must withdraw before the deadline to avoid a failing grade on your permanent college transcript.



GRADES



- Regularly check your grades online.
- Talk to your instructor if you have a question about a grade!
- Double-check if you think you submitted something and still see a zero before the term ends.
- You must earn a C or better to continue in an academic discipline.

A SECRET TO SUCCESS

- Take advantage of your instructor's office hours!
- Go early in the term ask questions or get personalized feedback on your assignments.
- Some instructors hold office hours at the high school, while others have online office hours after school.



KEY DATES FOR 2018-2019 DUAL CREDIT



- All <u>testing</u> and <u>paperwork</u> must be completed by the TCC deadline: April 20, 2018
- Payment is due a week before the first day of class (fall and spring).
 - May be made online via WebAdvisor or in person at any TCC Business Services Office.
