

Health Screening - Parents/Guardians (Post on the web, social media, email, blog and peachjar)

PARENTS/GUARDIANS: Before sending your child(ren) to school each day, YOU are responsible for screening them for COVID-19 symptoms. When each child reports to school, YOU are acknowledging that you have taken his/her temperature, and they are not experiencing COVID-19 symptoms, meaning symptoms that are not normal for them.

If symptoms are present, the parent/guardian should contact the campus nurse for further guidance on if, or when, the child(ren) should report to school.

COVID-19 Symptoms include:

- Temperature of 100 or greater
- Chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Muscle aches
- Headache
- Diarrhea
- Vomiting
- Sore throat
- Loss of taste or smell

While on campus, any student who experiences symptoms will immediately report to the school clinic. If the temperature is 100 degrees or greater, a second temperature will be taken to verify the first reading. If the second reading reflects a temperature of 100 degrees or greater, the student will be sent home immediately.

Phone Message

Hello, this is Birdville ISD calling families to remind families that before you send your child or children to school each day, you must screen them for COVID-19 symptoms, meaning symptoms not normal for them. The symptoms are a temperature of 100 degrees or greater, chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, muscle aches, headache, diarrhea, vomiting, sore throat, or loss of taste or smell. If your child or children have any of these symptoms, please contact the campus nurse for further guidance on if, or when, they should report to school.

Health Screening – Staff (Post on staff web, e-news, email, hard copy to principals and department heads)

ALL STAFF: Before arriving at your campus or department each day, you must ensure that you are free from COVID-19 symptoms, meaning symptoms that are not normal for you. If symptoms are present, first contact your healthcare provider. After visiting with your healthcare provider, if they determine you have COVID-19 symptoms, report it to your immediate supervisor and await further guidance.

COVID-19 Symptoms include:

- Temperature of 100 or greater
- Chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Muscle aches
- Headache
- Diarrhea
- Vomiting
- Sore throat
- Loss of taste or smell

When you, as a staff report to work, you are acknowledging that you are not experiencing COVID-19 symptoms.

Any school staff member who experiences symptoms while on campus must immediately report to the school clinic for a temperature screening. If their temperature is 100 or greater, a second temperature will be taken to verify the first reading. If the second reading reflects a temperature of 100 or greater, the staff member will be sent home immediately.

Health Screening - Visitor

Person screening secured front door (script):

On the door in front of you is a list of COVID-19 symptoms and a definition of close contact.

1. Do you have symptoms of COVID-19, or have you tested positive for COVID-19?
2. Have you been in close contact with a person who tested positive for COVID-19 in the last 14 days?

If the response to either question is “Yes,” do NOT buzz the visitor into the building. Instead, advise them that they will not be allowed access into the building because of their responses. Then, instruct the person to call the campus office for assistance. If the person does not want to call, notify the principal or assistant principal that the person requires assistance.

Poster for front doors (add a big STOP sign) - *Communications is designing posters for the doors*

ATTENTION ALL VISITORS: Before you will be allowed in the building, you will be asked a question concerning COVID-19 symptoms and one concerning Close Contact. If the response to either question is “Yes,” you will NOT be given access to the building. Instead, we ask that you call the campus office for assistance.

COVID-19 Symptoms include:

- Temperature of 100 or greater
- Chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Muscle aches
- Headache
- Diarrhea
- Vomiting
- Sore throat
- Loss of taste or smell

Close Contact is defined as:

- Being directly exposed to infectious secretions (e.g., being coughed on) from a person who tested positive for COVID-19 in the last 14 days; or
- Being within six feet of that individual for a cumulative duration of 15 minutes.
