TIGER SAFETY

•We do the following drills Lockdown Hard/Soft Shelter in Place Fire Bad Weather



LOCKDOWN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE CAMPUS.

- Clear and lock all doors and windows
- Move out of view of windows or doors
- Check roll and account for all students
- Stay calm and silent
- IGNORE all school bells
- Do not allow any one to leave the classroom/area
- No cell phone or other communication is used



SOFT SHELTER IN PLACE POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS IN THE COMMUNITY

- Clear all students from halls, fields, and portables
- Inside activities continue
- Close all doors and windows
- Do not allow cell phone or other communication devices
- Classroom doors remain locked

HARD SHELTER IN PLACE POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS SITUATION ON OR NEAR THE CAMPUS

- Clear all students from halls, fields, and portables
- Inside activities continue
- PD/FD and EMT allowed on campus
- Do not allow cell phone or other communication devices
- Classroom doors remain locked



FIRE (DRILLS)



- Once the alarm sounds, teachers should grab a current roster and red/green card
- Students should walk in a **QUIET SINGLE FILE** LINE out the closest door to the area designated by their teacher.
- Classroom door remains UNLOCKED
- Teachers need to check roll and then hold up a red (missing student) OR green (all present)card.
- Once the All Clear is given students walk back inside in a single file line.

BAD WEATHER





Move all students inside





Move all students away from windows and doors



Move all students to interior walls Instruct students to drop to knees with back facing windows or glass Eyes closed/ears covered

 Before School- All students come into school at 7:45am

Prior to 7:45am there is no supervision. •After school- Employees outside the building until 4:45 **No** supervision after 4:45pm Every Passing period we have adults stationed outside around the school (show map)



INTERNET SAFETY

- Frontal Lobe Development
 - The function of the frontal lobe involves the ability to project future consequences resulting from current actions, the choice between good and bad decisions (also known as one's conscience),
 - Most experts believe frontal lob NOT fully developed until 20 in females and 25 for males. This is why Great kids make poor choices..
 - Stories: YOLO (You Only Live Once) cheerleader story, cyber bully, video games all night, Ms. Cox
 - IT can happen to ANYONE- character of child, the relationship you have with your child, etc. (50/50 Nature vs. Nurture)
 - My mom-Barbara Balzer- I still made bad choices, lied, sneaky while I was young.

HMS ADMINISTRATION RECOMMENDATION

ONLY allow cell phone to be able to make phone calls (no texting or internet capability)



 No One can monitor your child's entire internet activity on their phone or tablet when you are NOT physically with them (even then if you can't see their screen you really don't know)

OR (if you are like my secretary ©)

- MONITOR like Crazy- App that allows turn phone on and off (limit numbers of hours, lock it, monitor apps)
 - Apps that allow you to monitor (ex. Samsung family link- shows you what apps child has been on and for how long, location, Life 360- free app)
 - Know all passwords (and remember about your child's ability to create new social media accounts without your knowledge (Snapchat, Instagram, etc.)

REMEMBER: Peer pressure is more influential than parents, educators, clergy, etc. during the middle school years.
