

TYPICAL JUNIOR SCHEDULE

- 1.0 credit English
- 1.0 credit Social Studies
- 1.0 credit Mathematics
- 1.0 credit Science
- 3.0 credits Electives (as determined by student and endorsement)
- = 7 classes per semester

*You should never sit in a class you received prior credit- talk to your counselor if you have ?'s!





GRADES AND GPA

- GPA = \underline{G} rade \underline{P} oint \underline{A} verage
- Starts this semester and goes through your senior year (middle school credits taken for high school credit also count in GPA)
 - Cumulative GPA: <u>every</u> grade you've earned in high school
 - Birdville High School Reports our GPA on a 100 pt. scale
 - Rank is determined by GPA.
 - Freshmen year is the foundation year for rank and GPA so start strong and stay strong.
 - The key to a good GPA is good grades and good attendance.



GOOD ATTENDANCE

- State law be in class for 90% of the semester.
- Only allowed 8 days before you are in danger of not getting credit for classes even if you are passing.
- If you no credit a class due to poor attendance, then it will be posted onto your transcript like this: 95*, but in the credit column it will say 0.
- This means you will have to repeat the class.
- Poor attendance directly impacts your grades which impacts GPA.
- You also run the risk of having truancy filed against your which means court appearances and fines.
- Drivers license information!
- When trying to obtain your driver's license you must have the Verification of Enrollment form. See Ms. Wright in the front office to obtain a form.
- NO CREDIT = NO LICENSE for 7 months!



PROMOTING TO THE NEXT GRADE LEVEL

- In order to promote to the next grade level, you must earn the correct number of credits.
- Each semester you earn a .5 credit for every class you pass.
- 10th Grade: 6 credits
- 11th Grade: 12 credits
- 12th Grade: 19 credits
- Graduate with at least 26 credits



CONSIDERATIONS FOR COLLEGE

- Most colleges prefer students carry at least 4 academic classes per semester
- Students need to maintain or continually improve their GPA over each semester
- Most colleges re-compute academic GPAs
- Many colleges give honors and AP courses additional consideration when re-computing academic GPAs
- World language is a requirement for admission





RANK AND GPA

- Rank: your GPA compared to all the GPAs of other students in your grade-level.
 - EX: 48/417
- Transcript: Academic Record of all your high school courses, grades, GPA, rank and if you've met your state testing yet or not.
- Quartile: Your class is divided into 4 quartiles. The top quartile is the top 25% percent of the class, the second quartile is the top 50% etc. GPA also determines the quartile you are in.

HOW YOUR GRADES CAN AFFECT YOU

• College:

- 4-Year Universities have a requirement for admissions, usually 3.0 or higher
- 2-Year colleges do not have a requirement, but some of the programs do
- Scholarships: FREE MONEY!
 - Many scholarships are based on your academic performance
 - The higher your GPA, the more scholarships you may be eligible for
- Colleges have their own scholarships they can give you, many based on GPA
- Athletic/Activity Eligibility:
 - No PASS NO PLAY
 - Overall passing average
 - Research shows that involvement in sports/activities/clubs helps make you a better student
 - Time management, commitment, teamwork, responsibility

• Jobs/References:

- You are more hirable when you perform better
- People you use as references or for letters of recommendations will have better things to say!

YOUR STUDY SKILLS

Study Place

- No distractions, quiet
- Same place each time you study or do homework
- Have all the materials you need in one place
- Read material BEFORE it's presented in class

Take notes in class

- And keep handouts and worksheets
- Use these to prepare for upcoming tests/quizzes

Study for tests/quizzes!

- Don't do one cram session; study in smaller chunks the 3-5 days prior to the test
- Review all notes (re-write them!) and handouts until you feel prepared
- Ask questions before the test



YOUR STUDY SKILLS & TUTORING

• Stay organized:

- Use tabs, separate folders, binders whatever works for you!
- Make sure you know where unfinished work can be found, and where the things you need to hand in are located.

Use a planner/calendar:

- Don't rely on your memory!
- Helps you plan out your study time and be more efficient, especially if you have commitments outside of school!






- **Driving: VOE** forms can be obtained from Mrs. Robyn Wright in the front office. Please allow 24 hours. Her extension is 8028.
