To earn a distinguished level of achievement you must successfully complete the curriculum requirements for at least one endorsement, including 4 credits in science and 4 credits in mathematics to include Algebra 2.



GOOD ATTENDANCE!! YOU KNOW THE DRILL!

- State law be in class for 90% of the semester.
- Only allowed 8 days before you are in danger of not getting credit for classes even if you are passing.
- If you no credit a class due to poor attendance, then it will be posted onto your transcript like this 95* but in the credit column it will say 0.
- This means you will NOT GRADUATE!
- Poor attendance directly impacts your grades which impacts GPA.
- You also run the risk of having truancy filed against your which means court appearances and fines.





Things to know!





- Pay Application fee to college/university
- Send official transcript to college/university
- Send SAT/ACT test scores to college/university
- Meet deadlines







REGULAR DECISION, EARLY ACTION, AND EARLY DECISION

Deadlines: Pay close attention to application deadlines!

- Rolling Admission or Regular Decision: The vast majority of students who apply to a given institution will do so through regular decision.
- Early Action: Students will submit their applications before the regular deadline and will be informed of their admissions decision soon after (typically in January or February).
- Early Decision: Similar to Early Action, students will submit their applications before the Regular Decision deadline and receive their admissions decisions soon after. The most significant difference is that Early Decision is **binding**, which means that any student who applies and is admitted to a school through Early Decision is expected to enroll.

TRANSCRIPTS

May I help you?

I need a transcript, please



- Seniors- you may now request official transcripts be sent to colleges and universities through a service that BISD is using called Parchment. You should have received an email with instructions in your BISD email account, or you can go directly to the parchment website:
- https://www.parchment.com/u/registration/22496/account
- Recommended that when you create a Parchment account that you use your personal email (not school email) if you have one.
- Students will keep their Parchment account into and through college and once away from BHS will no longer have access to their BHS email. This way they don't have to remember to change their email account before they graduate.

• Students must arrange for the scores be sent straight from the testing company. You can request scores be sent from:

SAT: www.collegeboard.org

ACT: www.actstudent.org

- If you have not taken either exam, please schedule one AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. Or look at your school and see if it is not required due to COVID.
- You may take them again and some schools "superscore" your best scores together.



SCHOOL DAY SAT 10-13-21

- Only seniors who HAVE NOT TAKEN the school day SAT can sit for the BHS school day SAT on 10-13. Mrs. Beasley is in charge and here is the link:

APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID OPENS OCTOBER 1ST



- Go to www.fafsa.ed.gov for the application. YOU MUST FILL THIS OUT TO RECEIVE ANY FINANCIAL AID FROM ANY UNIVERSITY.
- NEW---This is a requirement for all seniors to graduate. You can sign an opt-out form. See your counselor.
- The application will be available October 1, 2021 and you will use your 2020 tax information. Be sure to have this document sent to the university of your choice.
- FINANCIAL AID IS FIRST COME FIRST SERVED, SO TURN IN YOUR APPLICATION AS SOON AS YOU CAN!
- TCC FAFSA evening- October 4th 6-7:30 pm in the library!



FINANCIAL AID TIPS

- Social Security Number (or Alien Registration Number if you are not a US citizen)
- Student's driver's license (if applicable)
- Tax return for you (and your parents, if applicable) from the prior-prior year. For the 2022-2023 FAFSA, this is your 2020 tax return.
- Bank statements, records of investments, and records of untaxed income (such as veteran's non education benefits and child support)
- An FSA ID to electronically sign the form (students and parents will each need their own FSA ID)
- You can obtain your <u>FSA ID here</u>.







SKYWARD ACCESS!!



Parents and students are encouraged to use Skyward access to stay current with grades and attendance. Parents can continue to use logins and passwords from previous years. New parents can get their logins/passwords from the front office with ID. This login will be used for Skyward, computer and Chromebook access, and most other applications within BISD. Username: First Letter of the Student's First Name + First Letter of their Middle Name + First 5 Letters of their Last Name + a 3 digit number. (ex Jane Doe Hawks would be JDHawks000)

• Password: Students will continue to use their password from the previous year. If they need to reset their password, you can email helpdesk@birdvilleschools.net (you will need your Student ID number) or a staff member can call the help desk at 5888 with the student's ID number ready.

 Students who are new to BISD may have a staff member look up their login and password.



OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION:



- **Driving: VOE** forms can be obtained from Mrs. Robyn Wright in the front office. Please allow 24 hours. Her extension is 8028.
- STAAR/EOC: There are 5 tests required for graduation. English 1 & 2, Biology, Algebra 1 and US History. Make-up tests begin December 7, and US History tests for Juniors begins May 4.
- **ADVANCED PLACEMENT TESTING** dates are determined by College Board. All AP test dates fall during the first two weeks of May. Specific information for particular tests can be looked up at www.collegeboard.com.
- **PREVIEW DAYS/COLLEGE VISITS** Still trying to decide on a college? Visit! Take advantage of preview days offered by colleges and universities. Check the university websites for preview days or contact the admissions office to obtain information about a campus visit.


