Playing Closed Captions in Video Downloaded from UnitedStreaming

Step 1 - Download both the video and the captions

- Locate the desired video at UnitedStreaming
- From the video play screen, click the link "Show Media Controls" in the upper righthand corner of your window
- Check the box that appears labeled "Enable Closed Captioning"
- Download the video by right-clicking the desired video clip (note the file name that you give this file)
- Download the captions by right-clicking the connext to the desired video clip into the same folder that you saved the video file (the file name must the same as the video file you downloaded in the previous step - only the extension is different).
- You should now have 2 files downloaded into the same folder with the same file name and different file extensions (yourfile.asx and yourfile.smi)

Step 2 - Play the video in Windows Media Player

- > Open Windows Media Player
- Choose Play > Captions and Subtitles > On if available
- Choose File > Open and navigate to the saved video file
- > Play the video. The captions should appear below the playing video.

What to do if the captions don't play after all this...

- Be sure your Windows Media Player is up to date with WMP open, choose Help > Check for Player Updates. If updates are available they will install automatically.
- In Windows Media Player choose Play > Captions and Subtitles > Defaults ... > Captions and Subtitles > Closed Captions
- In Windows Media Player choose Tools > Options > under the Security tab click "Show Local Captions When Present"
- From your desktop open My Computer and choose Tools > Folder Options ... > File Types
 scroll down to SMI. If the details show that it opens with anything other than
 Windows Media Player, click Change and scroll to select Windows Media Player
- > With all of that checked try again and captions should play properly.
