Digital Learning Spotlight

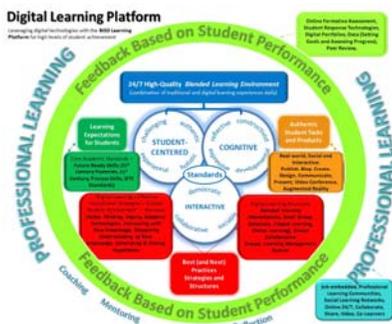
The Digital Learning Platform is comprised of six elements. We are featuring one element each week and spotlighting teachers who exemplify effective use of technology in daily teaching and learning.

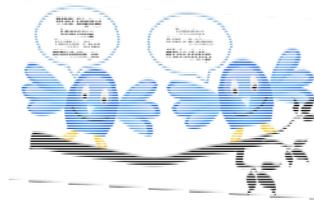
The 7 Habits of Highly Effective Teachers Who Use Technology
