



# 2017 AIJCA CONFERENCE HONOREE GREG CLIFTON

The AIJCA Junior National Conference Honoree is Greg Clifton from North Richland Hills, Texas. The founder of the "Chance Clifton Live Big Foundation" and long-time supporter of the AICA and AIJCA, has come to call the Charolais breed and the breeders family.

Greg Clifton was raised in Clarence, Missouri where his family raised commercial cattle,

hogs, and horses, and had a small grain and hay operation. He attended University of Missouri — Columbia receiving his degree in Animal Husbandry. While in college, Greg was a member of the Meats Judging and Livestock Judging Teams where he was introduced to the powerful Charolais breed. Greg recalls a moment on a judging team trip to Wesson Charolais and remembers how "intrigued by the big white cattle" he was. From there he started using Charolais bulls in his family's commercial Angus cow herd. He noticed the "added growth and efficiency" and became a "believer" in the Charolais breed. After graduation Clifton went to work for the American Yorkshire Club then was on to the Weeldy Livestock Reporter as one of their field representatives until 1989.

Clifton started auctioneering in the fall of 1989, his first Charolais auction was at the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo in 1990. A mentor and friend of Clifton, prominent Charolais auctioneer Colonel George Morse, told many stories of selling Charolais cattle over the years and was a great inspiration for Clifton selling Charolais as well as many of the other purebred breeds. Clifton has had the great privilege to auctioneer for many Charolais cattle sales all over the United States and considers the breeders like his second family.

When Clifton is not busy auctioneering, he is teaching and coaching Advanced Animal Science during the week at the Birdville Center of Technology and Advanced Learning. This is his second-year teaching and mentoring with the "inner city" youth of Richland Hills, creating a major

impact on them by highlighting the positive aspects of animal agriculture and how they can be involved. "Some of my ag students have gone on to become Ag teachers and Pre-vet students. This program gives them enough exposure and enthusiasm about animal agriculture that they want to become involved," said Clifton. The school has a nice show facility located in the middle of town where Clifton's main goal is to educate urban youth in an encouraging environment. All of Clifton's students live in town and keep their animals at the show facility. Being a part of the school's show team allows the youth to travel to some of the big shows across Texas. If the students show interest in showing, the faculty will encourage them to start out with a smaller animal like a goat or pig. When they have shown that they can handle the responsibility and can handle that animal, Clifton will give them the opportunity to show a Charolais heifer or steer through a scholarship program if they cannot afford to purchase their own. "For a lot kids, this is the first time they have had any kind of animal to teach them responsibility, care, selection and the whole gamut of taking care of and showing an animal," said Clifton.

The Clifton family had a major life changing event happen in June of 2013 when their son, Chance, was killed in an accident the summer before his senior year. Chance left a huge impact on others with his "live big" attitude so the family created the "Chance Clifton Live Big Foundation" in his memory. The foundation gives out numerous scholarships to high school seniors for college as well as helping families that suffer a tragic loss with financial assistance. The foundation gave many different scholarships in the first three years but the ones that they received the most response back from were the scholarships

that were awarded to the American-International Junior Charolais Association youth. "We were getting thank you letters, a lot of times three letters, throughout the year saying how much this has meant and really helping," said Clifton. "It is our privilege as a family to be about supporting the AIJCA and encouraging young people to live a life of excellence, diligence, hard work and hope."
