

Open Enrollment Transfer Information – All Students

(Residents and Non-Residents of the Birdville District)

GENERAL OVERVIEW

BISD is accepting OPEN ENROLLMENT transfer applications for <u>Resident and Non-Resident</u> students for the 2018–19 school year. However, because many BISD campuses are currently at or over capacity, the District began restricting Open Enrollment starting with the 2015–16 school year.

The intent of this change is to: (1) return current BISD students to their home campus/feeder pattern based on District boundaries, and (2) continue restricting Open Enrollment students from outside BISD to only those campuses where space is available. With this in mind, the following procedures are effective beginning with the 2016–17 school year:

- Current prekindergarten students will be required to return to their home campuses for kindergarten.
- Per Board policy, exceptions are made if the parent is a BISD employee or an older sibling will be in attendance at the same campus.
- All grade levels are still open to all BISD students at their home campus.
- Due to space limitations, grades K-3 and 6-12 will be closed to accepting *new Open Enrollment students who live in BISD*, unless the parent is a BISD employee or the student meets the older sibling exception. Open Enrollment students attending a BISD middle or high school campus during the 2014–15 school year may continue attending their current campus/feeder pattern through high school, as long as they meet the criteria below.
 - Open Enrollment fifth-grade students who live within the BISD boundaries will be required to return to the feeder middle school unless the parent is a BISD employee or an older sibling will be in attendance at the same campus during the 2018–19 school year.

Factors that will determine whether a campus is available for Open Enrollment transfers include, but are not limited to: building capacity, current program or campus enrollment, growth projections, grade level enrollments, teacher allocations, professional staff allocations, and the student's academic, behavior and attendance history.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Students applying for transfer are required to meet <u>ALL</u> of the following criteria:

- 1. Space must be available at requested campus or grade level.
- 2. The student must have 95% attendance for the previous semester and the last six weeks.
- 3. The student must be passing all current classes and all classes for the last semester completed.
- 4. The student must have passed all portions of their latest state-mandated test/assessment exam. Students from home schools, private schools or non-accredited schools must show satisfactory scores on standardized achievement tests at the 60th percentile or above, and/or successful achievement on a District-delivered academic test.

Transfer applications require approval by the campus principal. Students who wish to transfer may apply through the Open Enrollment process in grade levels that are open.

All approved transfers shall be granted for one school year at a time. Those participating in Open Enrollment must reapply annually.

There *will not* be a tuition fee for non-resident (out-of-district) students for the current school year; however, this waiver will be reviewed in successive years.

EXCEPTIONS

The following exceptions to the procedures outlined for the 2018–19 school year may be applicable, so long as a student meets the required criteria stipulated above for grades, attendance, test scores, behavior, tardies, and late pick-ups. Exceptions may be made if the applicant is:

- a current student at the campus.
- a 6th-, 7th-, or 8th-grader who was enrolled during the 2014–15 school year. The student may continue to apply at the current middle school and into the high school feeder pattern through the 12th grade.
- the child of a full-time District employee. A transfer may be requested with approval to be based on space and eligibility per the criteria.
- requesting a transfer to a campus outside of their attendance zone where an older sibling is in attendance. The older sibling **must** be on the campus during the initial enrollment year and must meet all other provisions of the criteria.

A student who becomes a non-resident during the course of a grading period may be permitted to continue at the current campus for the remainder of the six-week grading period. Prior to the end of the grading period, parents may request an Open Enrollment transfer if the student qualifies and space is available. If so, the student may remain at the campus as long as they meet the criteria in the same manner as other first- and second-year students.

THE PROCESS

- Parents may apply at up to three schools of their choice.
- Applications will be reviewed in the order they are received for students who meet the criteria.
 Preference will be given to the children of BISD full-time employees and students who are already in attendance at the requested campus.
- The applications will then be reviewed by the campus principal and an administrator in the office of Student Services to determine final disposition.

MOVEMENT INTO SECONDARY SCHOOLS

- A regular Open Enrollment student will not automatically move from elementary to middle school or middle school to high school. They must meet <u>ALL</u> Open Enrollment criteria. Fifth-graders who live within the BISD attendance zone will be returned to their home campus unless they meet one of the stated exceptions.
- Any regular Open Enrollment student may be denied annually based on behavior, excessive tardies, late pick-up or attendance.

All regular Open Enrollment students who are outside the campus attendance boundaries must reapply and qualify annually.

TRANSPORTATION

Any student who requests and accepts a transfer to a school other than the one in his/her home attendance area shall be required to provide his/her own transportation to and from school.

Campus Response: The application will be reviewed by the campus principal who will work to respond.

POTENTIAL REASONS FOR DENIAL

(Original Application)

- Record of poor attendance, late arrivals or pick-ups, and/or disciplinary infractions
- If application is for the purpose of participating in athletics at receiving campus
- Falsification of information
- Failing grades
- Failing state-mandated test(s)
- Failure to meet District criteria for transfer
- Decreased campus staffing
- Elementary projection exceeds 20 per class for K-4
- Elementary projection exceeds 22 per class for fifth grade
- Student projections reach 95% of campus/program capacity
- If any criteria is not met after being seated

If the student comes from Home School, Private School or Non-Accredited School

- Satisfactory scores on standardized achievement test at 60th percentile or above
- Successful achievement on district-administrated academic test

SPECIAL NOTES

- Students who participate in University Interscholastic League (UIL) athletics are excluded from Open Enrollment transfers until they have verified eligibility through the director of athletics (817-547-5820).
 - Students who move from one high school to another within the District (under the exemptions), are ineligible for varsity competition for one year by UIL rules.
 - Students who transfer for athletic purposes may lose all remaining eligibility.
- Application is per student and not family. This is required because the student is applying for a specific vacant seat in a specific grade at a specific campus.
- If a student is accepted and seated, the campus principal may review the application to ensure all criteria has been met. If any portion of the criteria has not been met, the seated student may be denied.
- The campus principal may revoke a transfer at the end of a school year based on the student's poor attendance, excessive tardies, inappropriate student behavior or other items listed on BISD's website. The principal must review the student's IEP prior to implementing this process for a student receiving special education services.
