

Course Descriptions are divided into content areas and are offered in grades nine through twelve in Birdville ISD. Information about course content, grade, prerequisites, and credits can be found in each section. In most courses, credit is awarded or denied at the end of each semester. Students are required to achieve a grade of seventy or higher to receive credit in a course. The Advanced Technical Credit (ATC) Program gives students a chance to receive college credit for taking certain enhanced technical courses.

Dual Credit Courses



- Students earn high school credit AND college credits at the same time.
- Taught by TCC professors on the Haltom HS campus
- All tuition is waived for dual credit students.
- Student must cover the cost of books & supplies.
- Courses transfer to in state, public institutions. For out of state or private institutions, contact them about specific transfer requirements.
- Available to 9th 12th grade students. Summer after 9th grade year would be 1st time to take college class. Classes offered during the school year are 11th and 12th grade classes.

- 4. Submit the Course Verification Form on or before February 28. Students will receive the Course Verification Form through their BISD email on February 21. February 28 is the final date for any course request changes for next year.
