WHATIS DUAL CREDIT?

- Dual credit classes are Tarrant County
 College classes for which students also
 receive credit towards high school
 graduation.
- They are the same as the TCC courses taught on campus.
- Sometimes referred to as Dual Enrollment.



WHYTAKE DUAL CREDIT?



ACCESS

Dual credit students are considered TCC college students and have access to all TCC student resources.



EFFICIENT

Earn high school and college credits at the same time!



SUCCESS

By earning transferable college credit in high school, dual credit students are more likely to have long-term success in college.

BCTAL offers a range of career and technical courses and certifications

- Non-eligible students are responsible for paying for their own learning materials (such




WILL MY CREDITS TRANSFER?

- ALWAYS ask the school where you plan to complete your degree what transfer credits they accept.
- Most TCC dual credit classes offered at BISD are part of the Texas Common core: classes that all public Texas colleges and universities must accept.
- Know the difference between elective credits and credits that will apply toward your degree!

NOTIFY YOUR HIGH SCHOOL

Let your dual credit counselor know you are interested in taking dual credit classes.


- APPLY FOR TCC ADMISSION
 Complete the online ApplyTCC application.
 Your high school will provide application instructions and deadlines.
- COMPLETE TESTING
 Take the TSI

SUBMIT REQUIRED PAPERWORK
This could include SAT/ACT test scores.

THE DUAL CREDIT PROCESS

REGISTER FOR CLASSES

Your counselor will specify the name and section number of the course you will be taking. Haltom will provide instructions and deadlines for course registration. You are not considered registered until you receive your confirmation email in your myTCC email account.



Haltom TSI info:

- The Texas Success Initiative (TSI) Assessment (TSIA2) is a test that evaluates a student's readiness for college-level coursework in reading, writing, and math.
- Haltom will administer their own TSI test on Jan 28-30 (\$FREE)
- If a student does not pass their TSI test, their counselor will change their 25-26 schedule to an AP or on-level course.
- Free online practice TSIA2 tests: accuplacerpractice.collegeboard.org
- Current classes lead students to be college ready as well

HOW CAN I BE SUCCESSFUL IN DUAL CREDIT?

- Work hard.
- Don't procrastinate.
- Know why you want to graduate with college credits.
- Be ready to deal with sometimes controversial issues or subject matter.
- Have at least 6 hours/week to study for a 3-credit class
- Ask your instructors questions.
- Get help when you are struggling.
- BE PROACTIVE!



STUDENT ACCESSIBILITY RESOURCES

All accommodations (IEP and 504) must go through TCC's Student Accessibility Resources (SAR) office.

If you require ANY form of accommodation, please notify the SAR department as early as possible. The deadline to apply is 20 business days before the first day of your dual credit class.

College accommodations are not retroactive.

In college, it is the student's responsibility to make sure that they are receiving their accommodations.





- The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a federal law that protects the privacy of student education records.
- Rights transfer solely to the student at age 18 or if the student attends a school beyond the high school level.
- FERPA Waiver of Privacy



- You must attend class at least 85% of the time; failure to do so may result in the professor dropping you from class.
- Involvement in high school extra-curricular activities and illness do not excuse you from course responsibilities or attendance – be very proactive in your communication with your instructor!





- CHECK YOUR GRADES REGULARLY IN CANVAS (MYTCC)
- TALK TO YOUR INSTRUCTOR IMMEDIATELY IF YOU HAVE A QUESTION ABOUT A GRADE YOU HAVE RECEIVED
- FOLLOW UP ON MISSING GRADES BEFORE THE END OF THE TERM



SET UP YOUR TCC EMAIL

- Check your myTCC email account regularly.
- All college-related emails should be sent from your myTCC email address...not your highschool or personal email address.
- All campus correspondence will be sent to your myTCC email address.
- Emails from your instructors will be sent to your myTCC email address.


