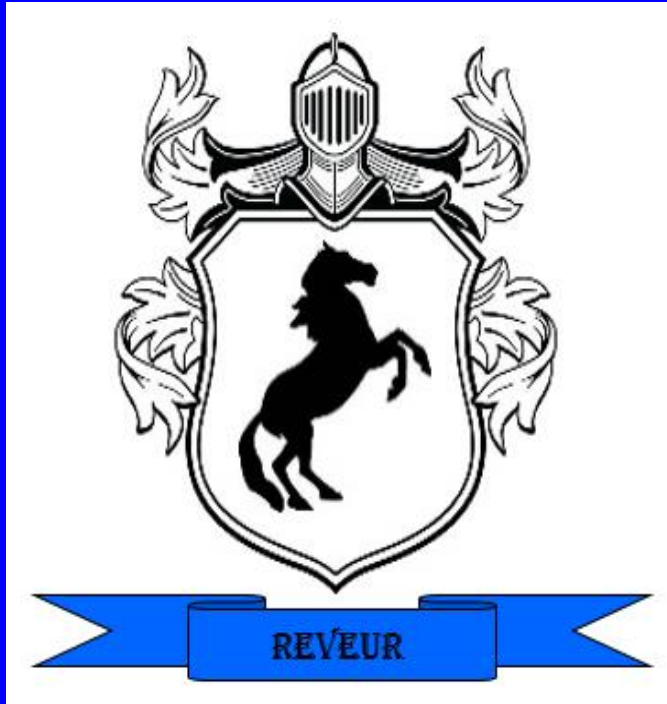

How to award House Points?

- Students who follow and show the Essential 10
- Students who show growth in the academic setting or achieve their learning goals
- Students who show a passion or spirit for their house and participate in events
- Students who have a positive attitude
- Only 1 point at a time
- No cap on how many points one student can earn
- Each teacher needs to give a reasonable amount of points each week.
- Every adult in the building can give points
- Having a classroom plan to show points is important to raise excitement about the process
- Teachers who CONSISTENTLY give out a lot of points will be REWARDED
- Teachers who do NOT consistently give out a lot of point will NOT be reprimanded

Who keeps track of the points?

○ The point masters (Tyler Chambers and Kimberly Barbe) will create a way for us to turn in points

○ Teachers will turn in points by the end of the day Thursday or they may enter points throughout the week

There will be a google spreadsheet for you to add your points at the end of each week.

○ Winners are declared on Friday
